	Agenda	Greg Grewal: comments now that the GSP has been accepted the GSAs have done their job with input from the public. I hope as we move these discussions on we can see what the problems are through the Annual Reports, then we can come to a reasonable decision on what it takes to balance the subbasin. The basin is a high priority basin subject to the possibility of overdraft. Nowhere in the documents that were signed does it state the basin is currently in overdraft. Now is our opportunity that the State has approved our GSP to go forward to promote our plan to show the State what we can do with our representative from the County Blaine Reely and the other people that are involved that we are going to do what we told them we were going to do. I hope that the people involved can go on with this and not put their personal interest or their groups ahead of what is beneficial for the basin. Because ten percent of the basin out of the 436,000 acres that is being irrigated, is not benefiting the basin. The benefit of the basin is for the majority of the people that live in the basin, not the ten percent that is irrigated. We need to isolate the areas that have the issues and solve it for those areas. Miles Duckworth: comments he is here to protest the hostile takeover of this Board by Supervisor Gibson. Supervisor Gibson has never attended these meetings in the past and kick off both of the Supervisors that do have districts overlying in this basin. Now we have residents and property owners over the basin with absolutely no representation on this Board. I hope that this will be rectified sometime in the future.

This is an item to make sure each GSA is aware of this request.

EPC President, Dana Merrill: comments the EPC would be a constructive addition to the PBCC and has operated as a good citizen. The EPC represents 35% of the basin pumping and agriculture needs more representation. The EPC also has 45 small, rural residents and reflects the rural component of the north County.

Mr. Merrill: responds the EPC has reached out to other GSAs and they have been supportive thus far.

Christopher Alakel: comments the Nacimiento title correction is good news because it put a halt to the plans to try to fully utilize the Nacimiento allocations several years ago. He says the Nacimiento participants are fully committed to developing that term back as soon as possible.

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	Matt Thompson: comments the City's recycled water distribution project estimated cost is \$35 million. The City was awarded a \$9 million grant from the State of California with a combination of a low interest loan. The City will now move forward on acquisition of the necessary easements for the pipeline and the City is aiming to have the project ready for bidding and start of construction by the end of 2023. In November 2022 the City applied for an additional \$5.7 million grant funding.
	Treasurer Gibson: comments there is a necessity for equity in the management actions of the PBCC. SGMA speaks to sustainability but also speaks about access to water, which is why the basin is taking on these extensive and expensive management actions. The idea of equity is engraved in SGMA and is engraved in the State Regulatory framework in the water code where it statutorily recognizes that every human being has the right to safe, clean, affordable, and accessible water. Upon reading the GSP it seems the expression and importance of that equity is not as strong as it could be and would like for the consideration of the PBCC and public to get the information out for discussion.
	Vice Chair Dodds: updates San Miguel Community Services District has started on recycling water project and appreciates the PBCC support.
	Chair Turrentine: updates Shandon-San Juan Water District (SSJ) on status of applications submitted to the State Board for unappropriated water and flood flows from both the Nacimiento and Santa Margarita Lake. SSJ is making a renewed push for these applications because it has been with the State Board for over two years. SSJ envisioned this as a basin-wide project with basin-wide benefits. Chair Turrentine asks the Committee on their willingness to agendize future discussion on ways to collaborate on the basin-wide benefits for this project.
	Treasurer Gibson and Secretary Hamon agree with adding this item to a future agenda.
